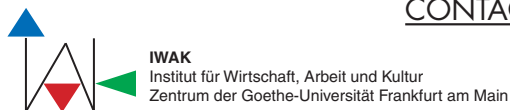

 - How can networking be supported?
 - How can new methods and data be disseminated to all observatories?
 - What could be the expectation towards a secretary of the initiative?
