



## NEWSLETTER JANUARY 2011

Dear Colleagues,

we hope you had a good start into the year 2011 and would like to inform you about the latest developments and activities within the European Network on Regional Labour Market Monitoring.

### *TOPIC 1: ANNUAL MEETING OF THE EUROPEAN NETWORK ON REGIONAL LABOUR MARKET MONITORING 2010*

The **annual meeting 2010** was hosted by CEREQ in Marseille. It covered the topic of “REGIONAL MONITORING APPROACHES FOR THE REDUCTION AND THE PREVENTION OF YOUTH UNEMPLOYMENT IN EUROPE”. Also covering this topic a group of network members published an anthology which provides an overview on the state of the art related to regional youth monitoring. The annual meeting was very successful and the discussion with about 50 network members and external experts was very helpful and innovative. The topic of youth (un)employment is also of high relevance for the DG Employment. Hence the network discussion is also oriented to the strategy 2020. In reconciliation with representatives of the DG-Employment the topic of youth (un)employment will be pursued also in 2011.

### *TOPIC 2: EUROPEAN DAY – AN INITIATIVE OF THE EUROPEAN NETWORK ON REGIONAL LABOUR MARKET MONITORING*

The Initiative “**European Day - Networking Regional Labour Market Observatories in Europe**” is a project located within the European Network on Regional Labour Market Monitoring. Preceding the annual meeting of the network in 2010, there was the first so-called European Day to provide an opportunity for Regional Labour Market Observatories to meet and have a European wide exchange. In the focus were best practice examples and mutual learning as well as analysis of the challenges for Regional Labour Market Observatories and strategies to solve them. The title of the first European day was “CONFRONTING EXPERIENCES & BUILDING BRIDGES IN THE PERSPECTIVE OF A COMMON LABOUR MARKET IN EUROPE”. About 150 representatives of Labour Market Observatories from across Europe participated during the two days conference in Marseille. ### *PERSPECTIVES:*

1. Representatives of the Regional Labour Market Observatories requested a close cooperation with the European Network on Regional Labour Market Monitoring. This will be realized in focusing on a common topic for the duration of one year. The first topic will be on regional youth monitoring as there are considerable challenges to bring or to keep



youth in labour in most European regions. The **Second European Day** (workshop with regional labour market observatories and network members) will take place on **October 6, 2011 in Luxembourg** preceding the annual meeting 2011 of the European Network on Regional Labour Market Monitoring. The title of the workshop will be **“PRACTICAL APPROACHES OF YOUTH MONITORS IN REGIONAL LABOUR MARKET OBSERVATORIES IN EUROPE”**.

2. Furthermore a **Scientific Committee** was founded in October 2010 to provide the “Initiative European Day – Networking Regional Labour Market Observatories in Europe” with a sound scientific basis. Prof. Ron McQuaid from the Employment Research Institute of the Napier University in Edinburgh is the elected chair of the Scientific Committee for one year. The other members are from Universities and research institutes in Italy, Germany, Denmark, Great Britain, France and Poland. A further task of the committee is to represent the initiative towards third parties. 3. Moreover a secretary to support the initiative operatively was established. As the initiative does not have any funding for a secretary, this function will temporarily be taken over by the coordinator of the European Network on Regional Labour Market Monitoring. There will be strong efforts made in the coming month to find funding for the secretary.
4. As the exchange between Regional Labour Market Observatories all over Europe is the main aim of the initiative a **databank** was build up. Currently it contains already some Observatories from all over Europe and is open for new entries. This databank can be used by the representatives of the observatories to find other actors with comparable profiles for exchange on certain topics to generate synergies in developing and exploring new areas. The databank is as soon as possible accessible for all interested parties via the website of the European Network <http://www.regionallabourmarketmonitoring.net/>. As this is the starting point, there should be brought more entries into the databank. You could support this in promoting the databank to observatories you are familiar or in exchange with.

### *TOPIC 3: ANNUAL TOPIC 2010/11 FOR THE EUROPEAN NETWORK ON REGIONAL LABOUR MARKET MONITORING*

The topic of the **network activities for 2010/11** is “MEASURING GEOGRAPHICAL MOBILITY IN REGIONAL LABOUR MARKET MONITORING APPROACHES”. It is about how labour mobility, especially Cross Border Mobility can be measured and implemented in Regional Labour Market Monitoring. This topic was considered to be of high relevance as there are still major challenges for most of the network members concerning the conceptualisation and generation of data on labour mobility on small scale level. This approach can be explored on the issues of transregional, transnational or cross border mobility or applied on different target groups like the skilled, the unskilled or even young job seeker or employees. This topic will be covered by an anthology of the network as well as by the annual meeting 2011 in Luxembourg.



It is planned to prepare an anthology which provides a state of the art overview on strategies, tools and data which are implemented or discussed in different European regions. This will provide the network members and other interested parties with a sound basis for further steps to measure labour mobility within the framework of regional labour market monitoring. Therefore a call for articles will be send to all network members. Also covering this topic there will be the **Annual Meeting 2011**. It will be hosted by CEPS/INSTEAD on October 7 at the University of Luxembourg in cooperation with EURES representatives.
